A concussion is a mild form of traumatic brain injury (TBI) caused by a bump, blow, or jolt to the head Concussions can also occur from a fall or a **Head Injury-Concussion and Symptom Scale**

concussion Return to Sports/Activity The injured person should never return to sports or active recreation with any persisting symptoms of a concussion and should not return to any activity until evaluated by a clinician When all symptoms have resolved at rest, follow a stepwise, symptom-limited program to return to sports activity outlined

Concussion Definition and Pathophysiology

During activities a concussion can occur with any type of external force to the head These events can cause the brain to accelerate and decelerate with translational, rotational and/or angular forces Brain injuries can result on the side of the force, cu, or the opposite side of the force, contra cu

Clinical Care Guideline: Concussion

Concussion typically results in the rapid onset of short-lived impairment of neurologic function that resolves spontaneously Acute concussion symptoms largely reflect a functional disturbance rather than a structural injury Concussion results in various clinical symptoms that usually does not involve loss of consciousness Resolution
